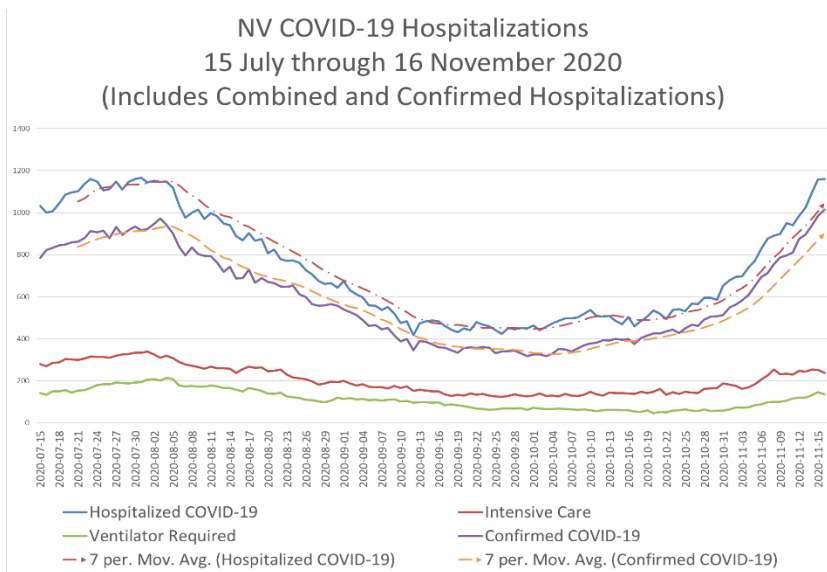
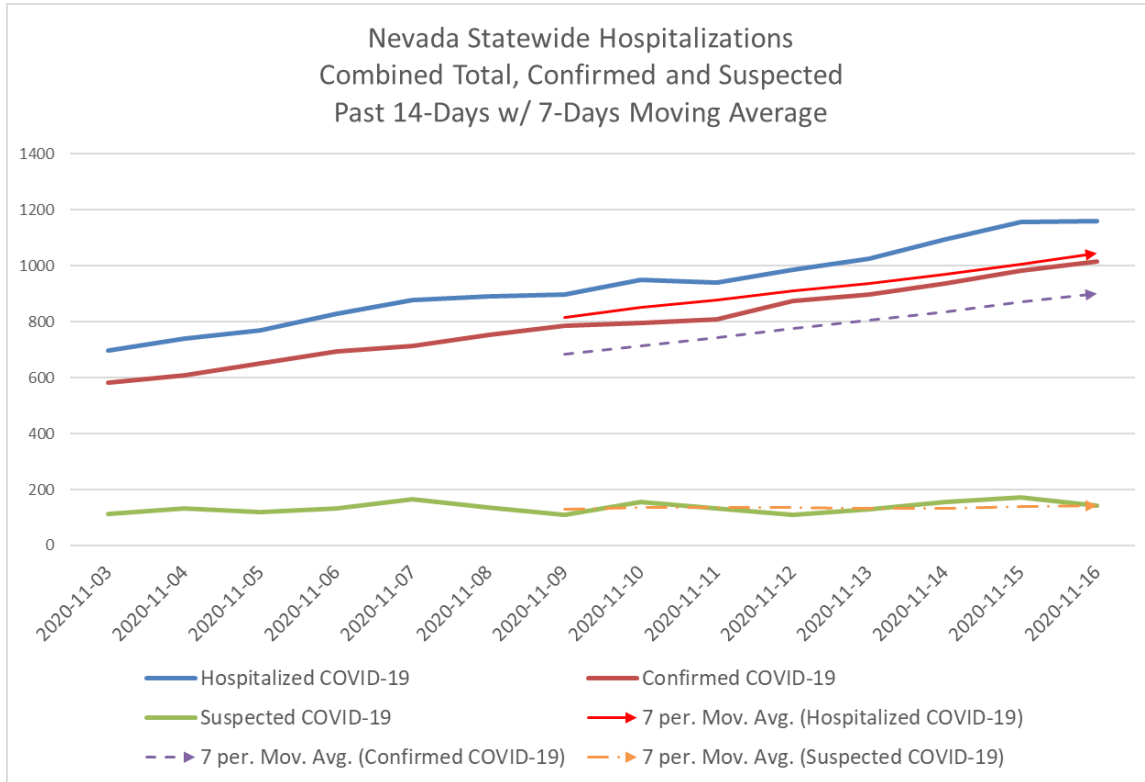

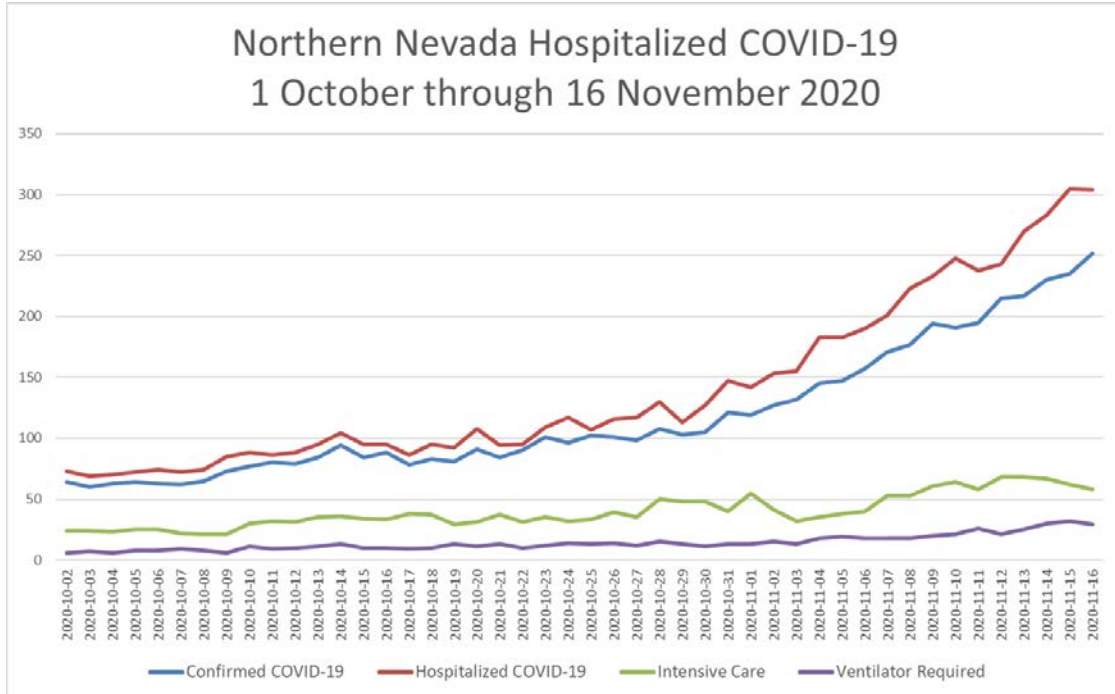
Increases in confirmed COVID-19 hospitalizations are appreciated with minor reductions in intensive care use and number of patients requiring ventilation.

It remains too early to determine the effects of the “Stay at Home 2.0” initiative. These decreases (ICU/vents) are most likely attributed to daily fluctuation, but the decreases in several key areas (no matter how small) are encouraging.

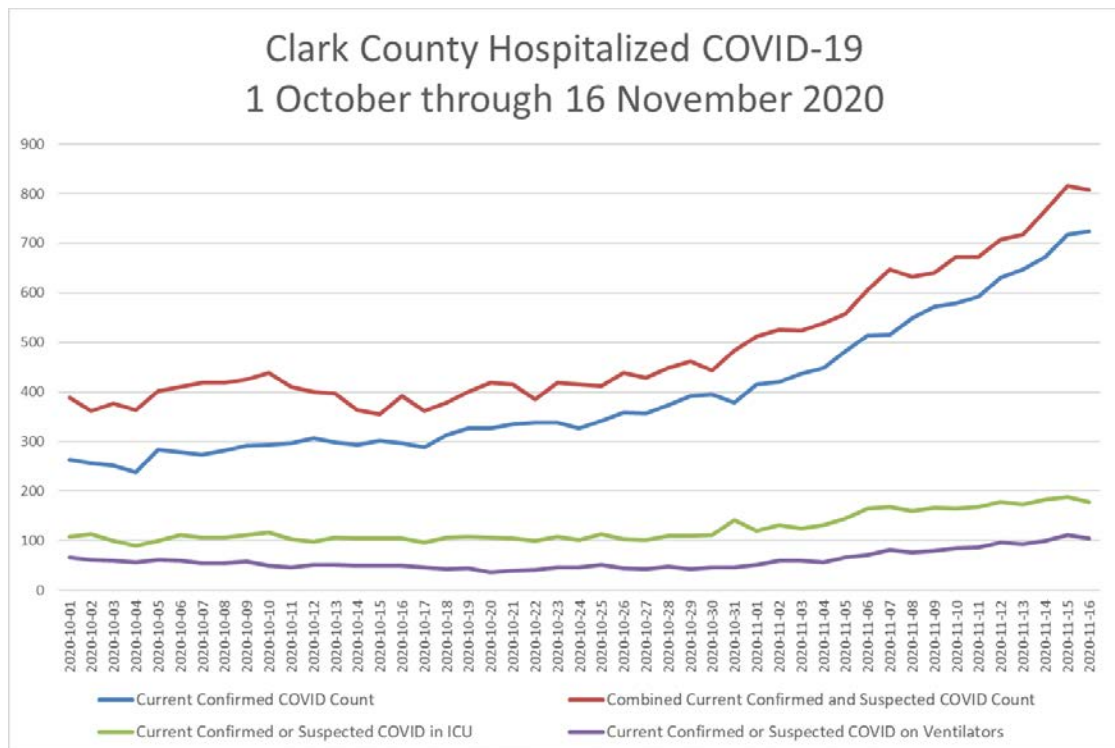
The healthcare community remains sympathetic with all Nevadans as this pandemic continues to persist through the holidays.

The healthcare infrastructure remains in fair condition as hospitals and health systems adapt to accommodate patient care demand. Note: while influenza is currently not of immediate concern, it will be imperative to get this wave under control before the Jan./Feb. flu season takes hold.

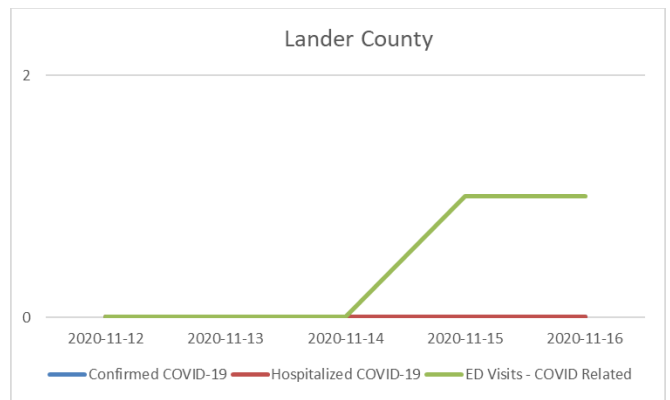
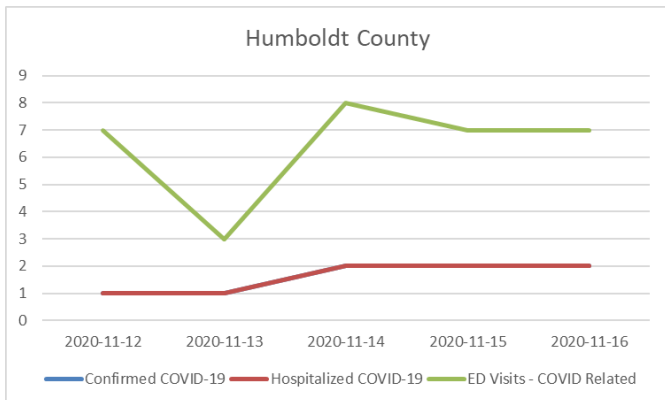
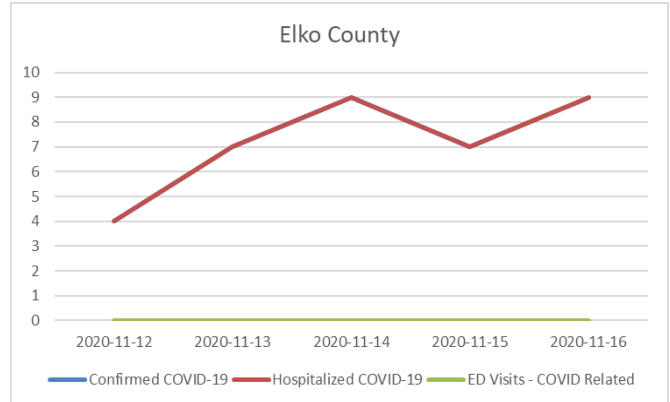
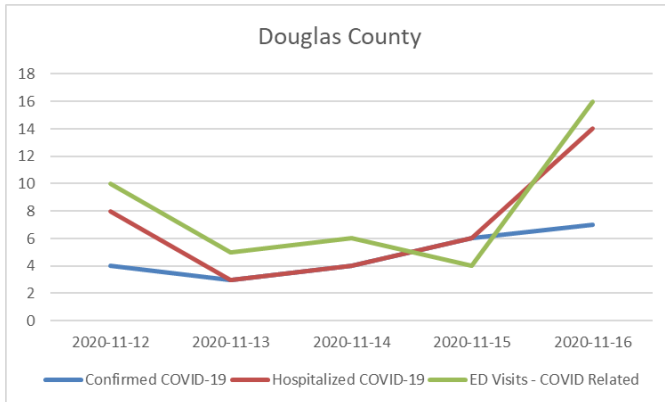
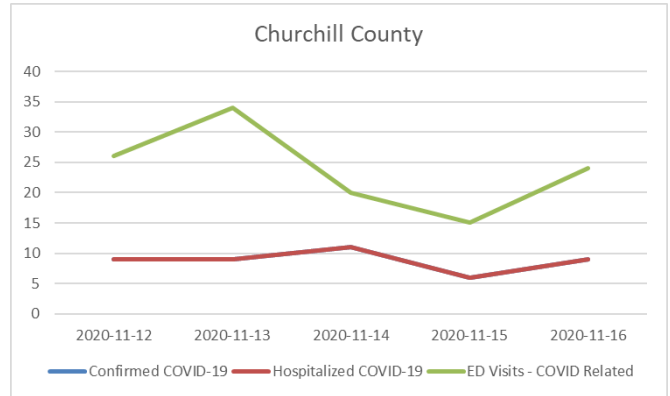
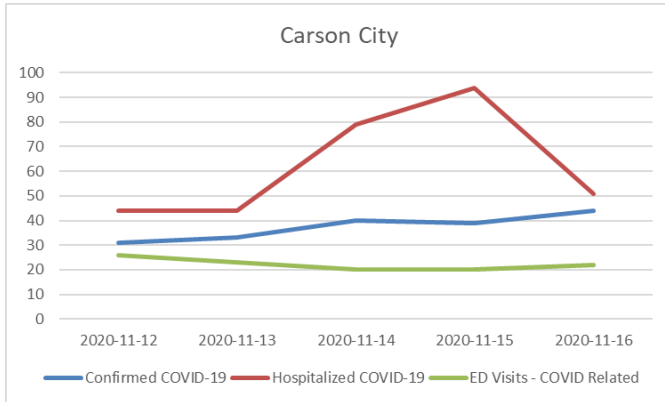
Northern Nevada Data Set



Clark County Data Set



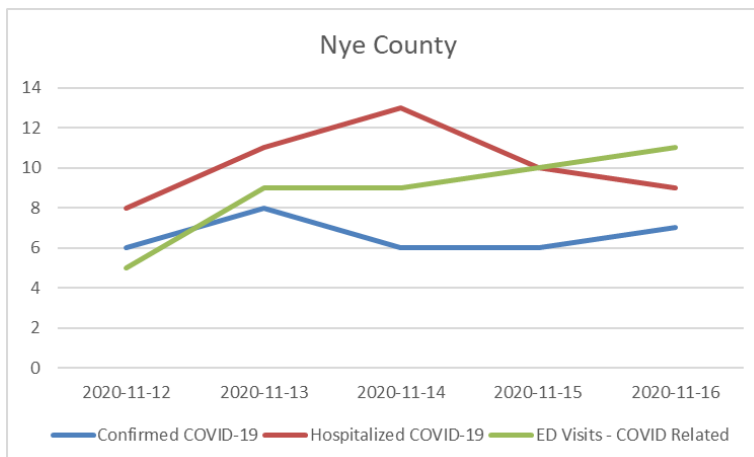
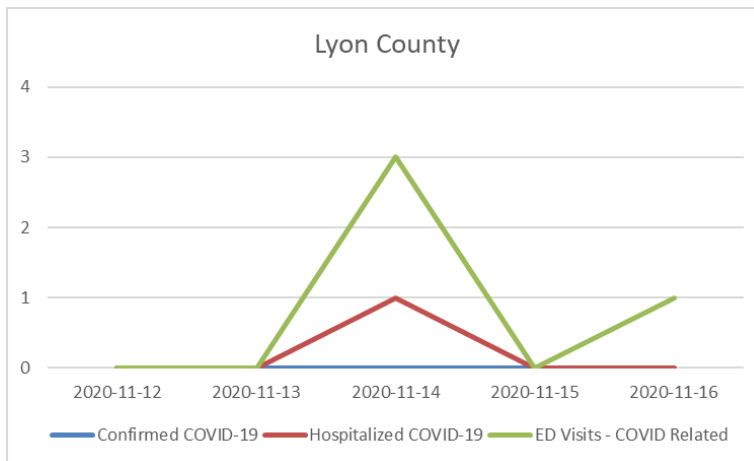
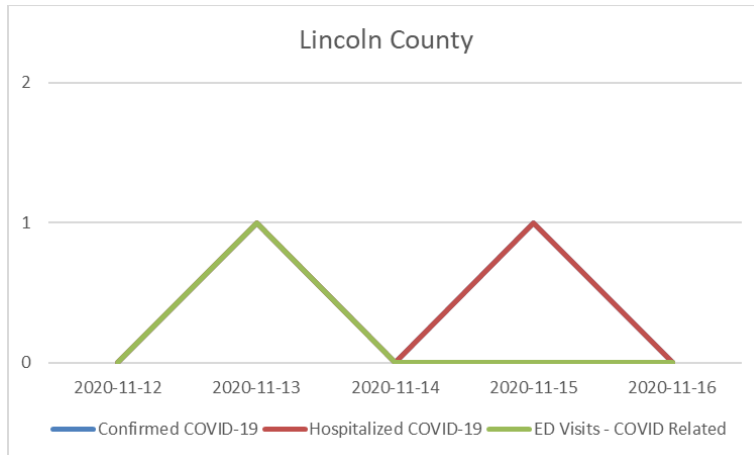
Rural Counties



Twelve (12) rural counties are flagged as having significant positivity rates however, relative demand of hospitals is not significantly impacting operations at this time. The one exception is Churchill County that is experiencing significant ICU utilization. Lincoln County is reporting significant hospital utilization however, none of these patients reportedly have COVID-19.

Emergency department (ED) visits for COVID-19 related chief complaints remains variable around the state but, consistently low. Elko, Lander, and Lyon Counties while flagged for high positivity rate, is not experiencing emergency department COVID-19 demand.

NOTE: If a "blue" line is not visible on the graph it is because "confirmed cases" are equal to the total number.
