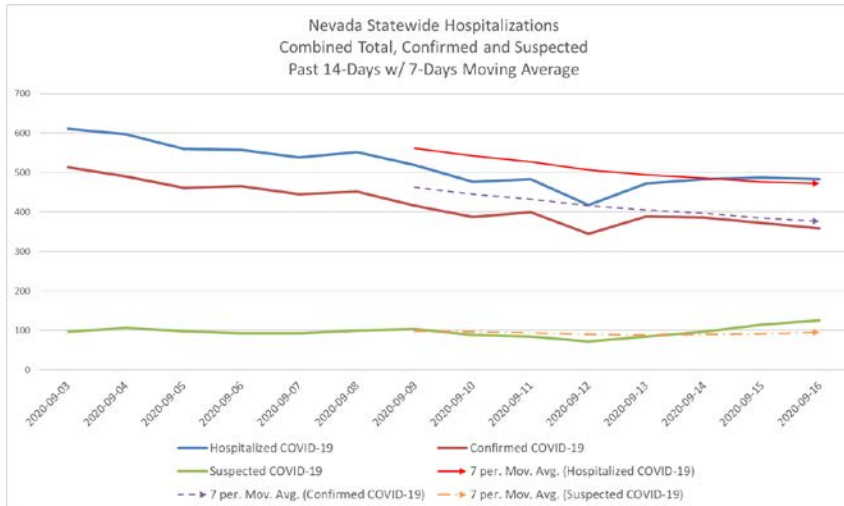
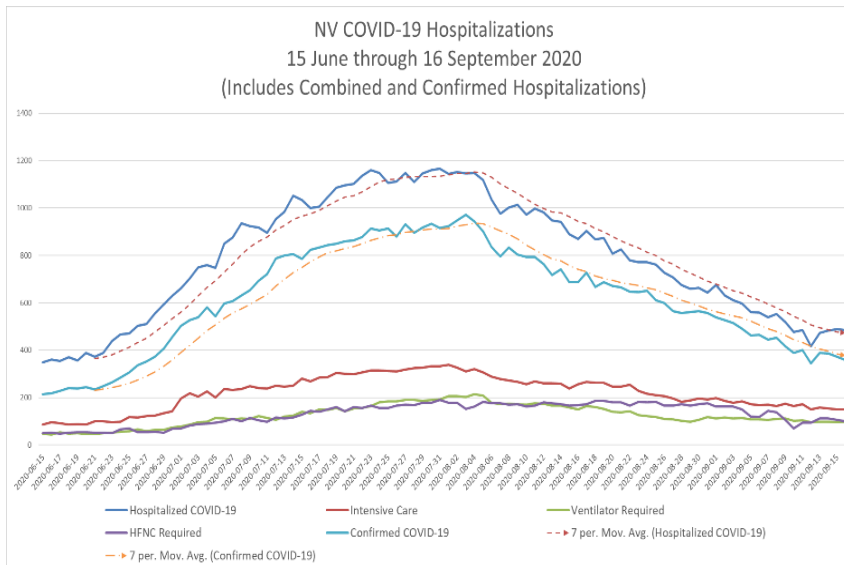


16 September 2020 Statewide Data Set



Nevada continues to see a decline in confirmed COVID-19 cases and a slight bump in suspected cases.

These fluctuations are anticipated following a major holiday and do not pose any issue so long as the infrastructure can adapt and incorporate new cases into the healthcare system. Nevada is well poised to accommodate the anticipated increases at this time.



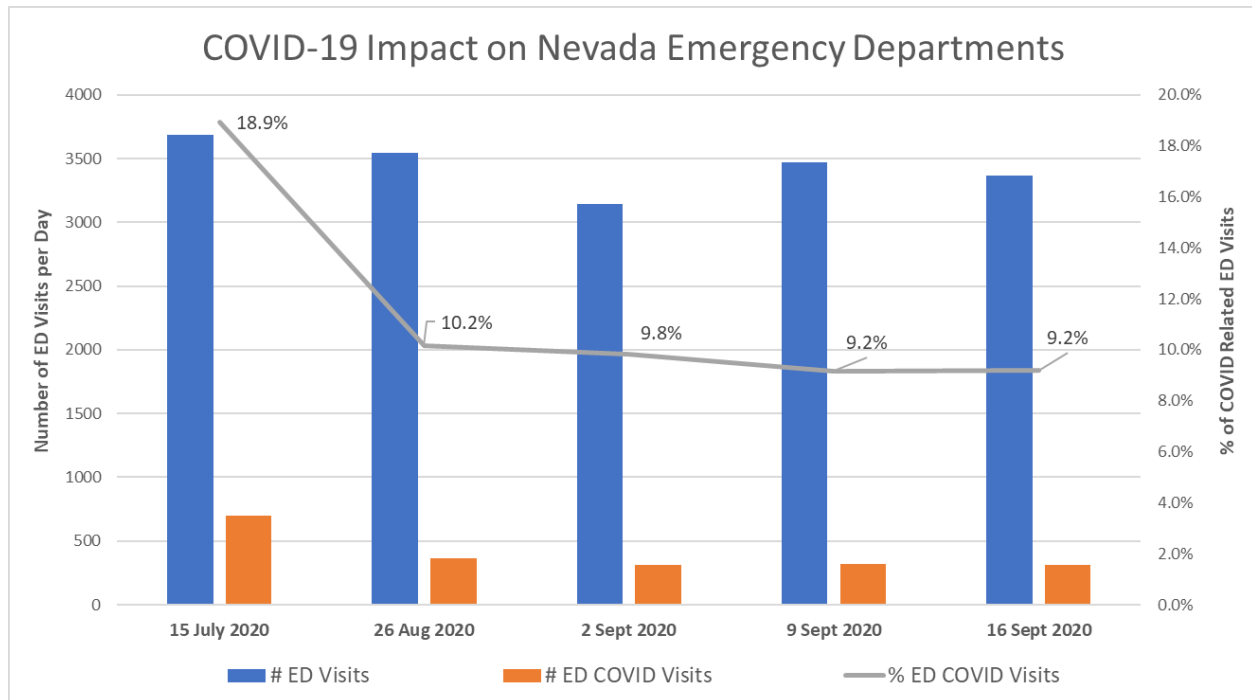
Relative demand of the statewide healthcare system by COVID-19 is as follows:

Patients with COVID account for 10% of all hospitalized people. They account for 25% of patients within the ICU and they are using 10% of the State's ventilator inventory.

Note: The Nevada Hospital Association (NHA) is

beginning to report healthcare infrastructure status in terms of "relative demand" instead of occupancy rates. This shift is necessary to accurately disseminate information regarding the impact that COVID-19 is having on our healthcare system.

Occupancy rates were beneficial when the healthcare system was near capacity and all-cause hospitalizations may trigger a surge capacity need. Now that hospitals are operating at or below their normal occupancy rates, reporting an occupancy rate without any context is of limited value to planners.



On 15 July, the NHA began capturing information related to the COVID-19 relative demand on hospital emergency departments. On that day, nearly 20% of all ED visits were related to a COVID-19 chief complaint.

The graph above illustrates the numbers of patients seeking ED treatment for COVID-19 related complaints has been steadily decreasing and now stands at 9.2% of all ED visits. The number of people seeking care at our emergency departments has remained fairly consistent.

The NHA will continue to monitor this metric as this could signal disease attenuation, development of herd immunity, less disease, or a change in attitudes or lessening of fear within the general public, as people learn to live in the climate of COVID.
